CHN had a community meeting about 5 weeks ago. There was neighborhood attendance, and there was push back. However, at the end of the meeting there were many 1 on 1 conversations that were positive. People were understanding that something needs to be done to the middle school.

CHN and OLHSA have been sensitive and respectful of the concerns people have raised. CHN is taking a look at if this doesn't get funded in the next round are there other possible approaches.

The immediate surrounding area of the middle school needs some re-development that will contribute to the community.
